MEDICAL STUDENT CLERKSHIP
RESPONSIBILITIES

OB STUDENTS:

1. Your first morning on OB attend morning report at 7:00 am. At the conclusion of sign-out you will receive labor and delivery and post-partum patient assignments. Each subsequent morning you will need to pre-round and write notes on the post-partum service patients to which you have been assigned and you will present them at morning report. You will see a maximum of 4 patients and they should be patients in whose care you participated. If there are no service patients you will help the interns round on the private patients. You should also round on any cesarean section patient whose surgery you attended, regardless of their status as service or private.
2. Attend morning report daily at 7:00 am and any other formal OB/Perinatal rounds during the day.
3. Attend High-Risk OB Clinic on Tuesday am only if there is minimal activity on L&D. Clinic begins at 9:00a.m.
4. Cover L&D during unassigned periods, working with residents in triage or writing labor notes on those patients to which you have been assigned. You will also need to perform history and physical exams on patients admitted and present them to the appropriate individual
5. One 10 minute presentation to be given at morning report on OB topic of your choice.

GYN STUDENTS

1. You will be assigned to O.R. and Ambulatory Surgery cases by GYN Chief Resident. Assignments are posted in the Residents Resource Room in late afternoon on the day prior to surgery.
2. Begin day at 6:00 a.m. Pre-round on all your post-surgical patients and be prepared to present them on team rounds prior to any cases each day. If there are no morning cases assigned to you, attend morning report at 7:00 am on labor and delivery.
3. Attend B6 Gyn rounds with team (am and pm).
4. Allow yourself 15-30 minutes prior to OR cases to introduce yourself to patients, help with H&P, meet attendings, etc.
5. Review surgical procedure and technique and major anatomic landmarks prior to case.
Common Procedures: Abdominal & vaginal hysterectomy
Myomectomy
Tubal ligation
Pelviscopy
Hysteroscopy/D&C's

6. Attend Colposcopy clinic on Wednesday mornings.
7. When not in surgery, use the time to study and read or you may go to the ER with the second year resident.
8. Attend any formal GYN rounds and lectures.
9. One informal 10 minute presentation at resident rounds on topic of your choice.

AMBULATORY OB-GYN STUDENTS

1. Attend morning report at 7:00 am on L&D.
2. Report to clinic after morning report. Clinics are as follows:
 - Monday am and pm – General OB/Gyn
 - Tuesday am – High Risk OB, pm – General OB/Gyn
 - Wednesday am – General OB/Gyn and Colposcopy (covered by GYN student), pm – General OB/Gyn
 - Thursday am – High Risk OB, pm – General OB/Gyn
 - Friday am – General OB/Gyn, pm – No clinic* There is no clinic the first Thursday morning of every month.
3. Initially see patients with residents. Types of visits and what you should perform:
 - a. New OB – Follow ACOG form. Obtain history and do physical up to pelvic, then present to the resident or attending who will do pelvic exam with you.
 - b. Return OB – Ask if there are any issues then ask specifically about vaginal bleeding, contractions, leakage of fluid, and fetal movement. Address issues in problem list and gestational-age appropriate questions. Measure fundal height when appropriate, fetal heart tones, perform Leopold's maneuvers, then present to residents or attending.
 - c. New GYN/Annual Exams – Perform complete history and physical up to breast and pelvic exams, then present to resident or attending who will do pelvic/breast exam with you.
 - d. Follow up GYN – address issue in SOAP format
4. Read about basic OB & GYN Ambulatory problems.
 - (a) Routine prenatal care - timing of various antenatal laboratory tests and their significance.
 - (b) Common gynecologic problems and differential diagnosis:
 - i.e. Vaginitis, abnormal bleeding, STD's, Pelvic Pain, Contraception, Genital Prolapse, etc.

ONCOLOGY STUDENTS

1. Report to B6 for Oncology rounds as directed by Chief Oncology Resident (usually 5:30 AM)
2. Scrub on oncology cases as directed by Oncology Chief
3. Attend oncology sign-out rounds
4. Attend attending oncology rounds and their lectures. Dr. Abbas lectures every Wednesday at 7:00 AM; Tumor Board follows at 8:15 AM every Wednesday (**All students and residents are to attend Dr. Abbas's lectures and Tumor Board**)

5. Do H&P on patients admitted for surgery, chemotherapy, or with complications and be prepared to present these patients.
6. Present one oncology topic to oncology residents and attending (10 minute presentation).
7. Attend clinic with Dr. Abbas at Sinai on Wednesday if not in lecture.
